

3rd Grade Summer Work 2018-2019

Dear Parents,

I look forward to having your child in my class next year. As many of you know, each teacher assigns summer homework. I want to make clear that the reason we assign summer work is for students to practice and maintain some basic academic skills. The following is a list of what I am expecting the incoming 3rd graders to do to maintain those basic academic skills:

- Read each day. Students should read at least 10 minutes each day, and SOME of that reading should be done out loud. Students should select a book with a Lexile Level of about 500L. If you are unsure of what this means or how to find it, please contact me: jvatsend@stolafs.org or 801-230-4385. I will also be at the school all summer long helping to run summer camp.
- Flashcards. Please get a deck of playing cards, then students should practice both addition and subtraction. They should focus on one number at a time until mastered. Spend about 2-5 minutes per day. A little practice each day amounts to much more than a lot of practice on just one or two days.

All the summer work breaks down to about 15 minutes of work each day! I promise that daily practice of the assigned work will benefit your child's overall academic growth, as well as prepare them to be successful in 3rd grade.
