

In-coming Fifth Grade Summer Reading List

Required Reading: Shiloh – Phyllis Reynolds Naylor

During this summer, you are encouraged to read each day. The required novel for students entering 5th Grade will be Shiloh by Phyllis Reynolds Naylor. After reading the book, students will complete a project that will be put on display on the first day of school. For this project, students can make a collage that shows Shiloh. The collage can be formed out of newspaper, magazine pictures, cloth, construction paper, etc. It can be a 3 dimensional figure. Make sure that you use descriptions from the story as you develop your collage.

In addition, students will complete an assessment on the book the first day of school. Each day after reading, students should spend 10 minutes writing a response about what was read. The response can be written in a notebook or on lined paper and then stapled together. Some ideas for the response are:

Character – description, development/change in character

Things you like or dislike about the story.

Main idea
